Park Maintenance: Nancy van Arkel announced that the park clean-up on Saturday 9/13 will focus on clipping back the vines on the fence and cutting back on the tall grasses. Also, the October clean-up date has been moved from the 2^{nd} Saturday to the 3^{rd} Saturday in October to 10/18/25 because of the holiday weekend. An additional park sign is scheduled to be installed on 10/6/25 at the southeast park entrance.

Park Memorials: Recently, we have received requests to dedicate trees in memory of the deceased. Instead, we decided to offer to post a memorial message about the deceased on the park's website for a donation to the park. Joe Walsh and Nancy van Arkel are in the process of drafting a policy for this procedure.

Park Pests: Recently, the park has been besieged by an influx of rats. Jim Fennell and others have called Vector Control (215-685-9000), which is the City of Philadelphia's department which handles rat problems. Vector Control has placed traps around the park. In addition to the traps, based upon our experience, we realize that we need to replace the plastic trash can liners as the rats have chewed through the bottom of the plastic to get to discarded food. It was suggested that we also experiment with metal cans instead of plastic liners. As mosquitos are also a problem, Joe Walsh has been placing oil in the water puddle near the sprinklers system to kill mosquitos.

Treasurer's Report: Joan Markoe submitted the August financial statement.

Last year's event attracted between about 100 dogs. A budget of \$300 was approved for the event.
