Asters are currently in bloom. Nancy van Arkel reported that the Autumn Clematis on the southern fence may have been damaged by the herbicide sprayed on the Mulberry trees. However, she believes that if they are cut back, it will allow them to re-generate. After the November clean-up, the Sunflowers will be removed. Next spring, they will have the contractor take back the responsibility for the pre-emergent weed treatment.
